
We will develop an overall activity list to help members keep track of events.

Brothers,

When Father McGivney founded our Order, a key part of his mission was to help Catholic families attain a secure financial future. It was a hard time and place to be Catholic, but he didn't want them to feel they had to let go of their Catholic identity in order to find that stability. He wanted them to see their Catholic community as a place of security – to know that here, their faith could grow. And here, their families would be protected.

In keeping with that mission, Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly recently announced updates to our member benefits. Now, you might not even remember you have these benefits – in a sense, they're the best kept secret of the Order, but I'm going to do my part in making sure they're more widely known.

I'd like to highlight some of these updates, starting with one that affects all of us.

Whether or not you are an insured Knight of Columbus, you are entitled to the <u>Member/Spouse Fraternal Benefit</u>. This is an accidental death benefit for all members in good standing and their spouse. The benefit amount varies from \$1,500.00-\$5,000.00 depending on your age, whether you are insured and how long you've been a member.

The second update I'd like to call out is the <u>Family Fraternal Benefit</u>, which applies to insured members. It's guaranteed-issue insurance up to \$10,000.00 to any child under age 18, regardless of physical or intellectual disabilities. This also includes an automatic \$5,000.00 death benefit for children who die before age 61 days, including stillbirths from at least 20 weeks after conception.

Next is the **Orphan Fraternal Benefit**, which provides \$500.00 monthly to an insured member's child who has lost both parents, up to age 19. This benefit also includes up to \$5,000.00 per year in college scholarships, with a maximum total of \$20,000.00 per eligible orphan.

Finally, the <u>Widow Benefit</u> offers surviving spouses of insured members the opportunity to purchase life insurance, long-term care insurance, disability income insurance or annuities, and she and her children are eligible for scholarships.

We strive to bring Father McGivney's mission to life by offering you these valuable benefits. I would like to sit down with each and every one of you to walk you through the benefits available to you and your family. Please schedule an appointment with me as soon as possible.

Thank you, and I pray that Blessed Michael McGivney watches over our families this month.

## WHAT BAGGAGE WILL YOU DUMP? TO LIVE MORE FULLY IN GOD'S LOVE

Jesus says, "Only with difficulty can one who is rich enter the kingdom of heaven." Lest we think we're exempt from this warning if we're not wealthy or because, if wealthy, we use church attendance as a guarantee for living in God's kingdom.

He says in those verses: "By your wisdom and your intelligence you have made riches for yourself." Your wisdom, your intelligence. We can ask ourselves, "What am I rich in (and not necessarily material wealth) by my own doing? What did I achieve in abundance without prayerfully seeking God's approval and relying on his guidance and help?

Jesus tells us that we must let go of our attachments to the world so that we can enter fully into the kingdom of God, not just when we die, but now, so that we can experience his unconditional love each moment of every earthly day.

We pile so many worldly attachments upon our backs that we're like camels laden with luggage! None of this baggage can squeeze through the gate into God's kingdom. If we try to hold onto them, we don't fit through the gate.

We are rich in "doing things my way." In the kingdom of God, everything is done his way, which of course is the best way. No "conditional" love can get through, because it's not truly love. The attitude of, "If you make me happy, I will approve of you and accept you and be nice to you" is a huge load of trash.

The garbage that others have thrown at us won't fit either. Nor will the emotional bandages that we use for covering the wounds they inflicted upon us. Jesus has already taken all of our blows upon himself. If we're still wounded by them, it's only because we haven't surrendered to every method of healing that he knows will heal us.

We can't include the baggage of self-righteousness or pride. We don't need it anyway, because Jesus is proud enough of us. We have to drop the baggage of low self-esteem, because Jesus shows us our true worth, and it is far greater than we think it is.

Identifying all of our worldly bags so that we can free ourselves from their weight seems impossible. The disciples asked, "Then who can be saved?" Jesus answered, "For you this is impossible, but if you seek God's help, it will become very possible."

It starts with this daily attitude: "Forgive me, Lord, and help me to identify all my bad habits, addictions, unloving ways, and worldly wisdom. With your gentle but persistent help, I will let go of my baggage and live more fully in your kingdom now and become more ready for heaven when I die. Increase my desire to get rid of everything that does not belong to you. **Amen!**"

Pope St Leo I, was the 45th pope of the Catholic Church and the first to use the name Leo, which was also his birth name. Known for convincing Attila the Hun to not invade Italy, the pope is a saint in the Eastern Christian Church.



#### October is the Month of the Rosary

fleet at the Battle of Lepanto on October 7, 1571, which was attributed to the intercession of the Virgin Mary through the praying of the rosary.

- 1. Deepen our devotion to Mary through praying the rosary regularly
- 2. Reflect on the mysteries of Christ's life, death, and resurrection
- 3. Seek Mary's intercession for personal intentions and global peace
- 4. Strengthen family bonds by praying the rosary together

The rosary is seen as a powerful spiritual tool that helps believers:

- Meditate on Scripture and the life of Christ
- Cultivate inner peace and mindfulness
- Grow closer to Jesus through Mary's example
- Find comfort and strength in times of difficulty

As members of the Knights of Columbus, we are given a rosary when we join and are reminded of the love Mary, our spiritual mother, has for us and that she is there to intercede for us to Christ and God the Father. Also, we are challenged to prayerfully pray the rosary as a part of our daily prayer life. 
